



**NCA Chapter Legislation and Funding Survey - Summary Report** There is an ongoing and vital need for you to have access to current, accurate information about: **(1)** Which states have defining/enabling legislation related to children's advocacy centers and where you can access the exact language in those statutes; **(2)** Which states currently have state dollars appropriated specifically for support of children's advocacy centers; and **(3)** Which states provide state funding support for their Chapters.

The report is a summary of the information collected from our NCA chapters via a Chapter Legislation and Funding Survey completed in March 2015. Our intention is to update this report annually, or more frequently as needed.

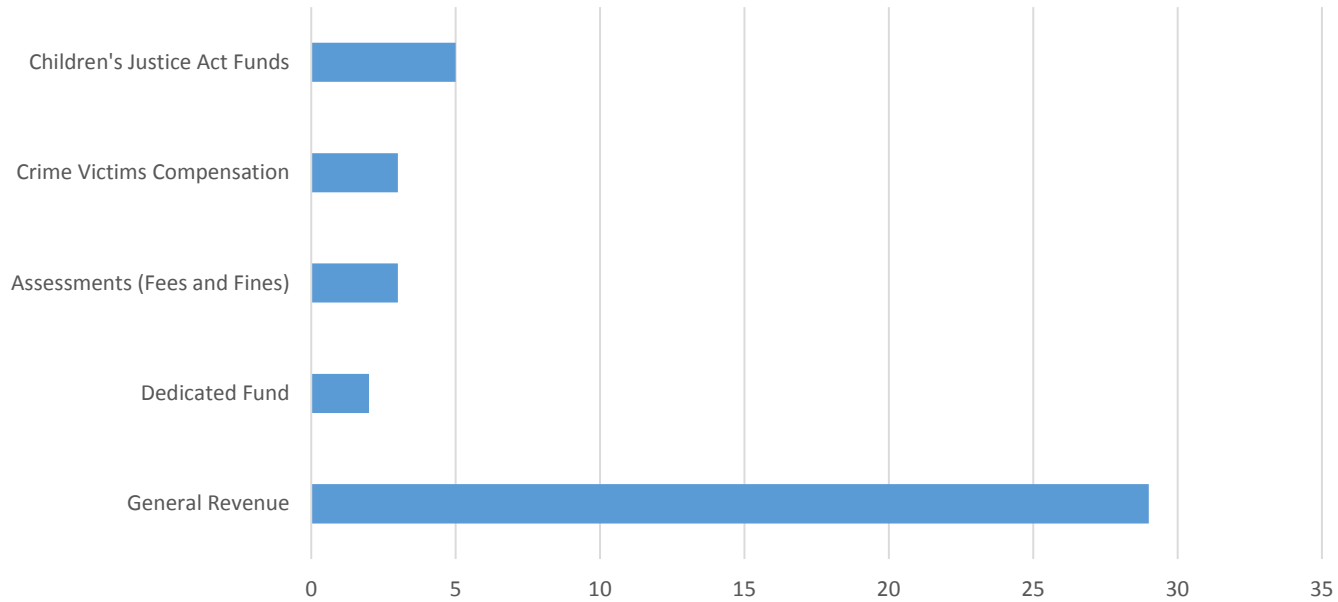

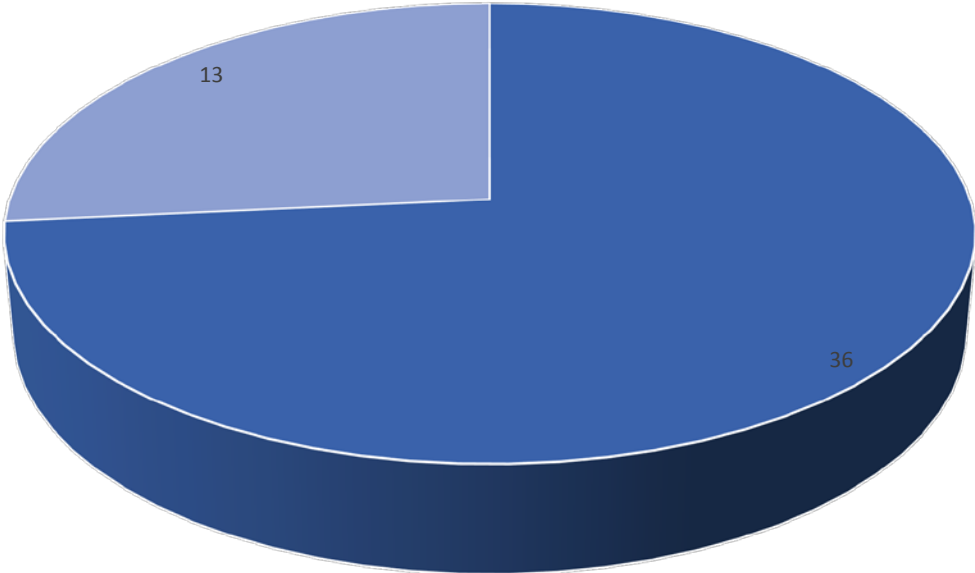

**Since 2013, less than 1% of states who receive dedicated CAC funding experienced a DECREASE in their total allocation**

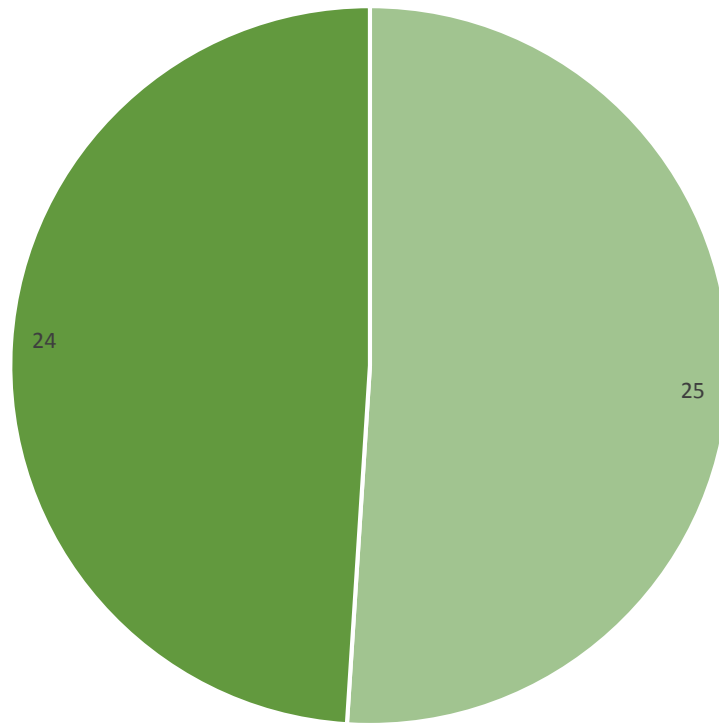
